Since we closed our doors on March 17th, we knew the day would come when we would be able to welcome our members back into our facilities again, but we never realized what a long and arduous road it would be. While we have finally opened our doors, it is in a very different environment from one that our staff and members are used to, but one that will hopefully get better in the coming months. Things have been moving along at a very fast pace since we were given the go-ahead from Governor Murphy that gyms were allowed to reopen at a maximum capacity of 25% on September 1st. We quickly reached out to our members to let them know that the branches would be opening up indoors, with reduced hours at first, but fully expecting to expand those hours in the near future. Starting September 12th, we were able to offer our members use of the facilities seven days a week. This was not an easy task, and a huge thank you goes out to our leaders and staff who worked very hard to make this happen. While members are asked to make appointments for indoor fitness, we continue to offer outdoor fitness as well as virtual fitness classes to provide a multitude of ways for our members to work out while feeling safe and comfortable. #foreverthriving

Gov. Murphy visits Edgar Learning Center to Announce \$250M Child Care Initiative

The lobbying efforts of Rose Cushing and many other child care advocates has paid off! On August 28th, Governor Murphy visited Edgar Learning Center to announce that he is dedicating \$250 million from the Coronavirus Relief Fund to provide support to families with school-age children and supporting the reopening of child care centers. The State's Department of Human Services will provide subsidies for children ages 5-13 through the end of 2020. The Child Care Subsidy Program is available for families with children with incomes up to 200 percent of the federal poverty level who meet program criteria. The Department of Human Services will also create a new \$150 million program to provide child care support to New Jersey families who are not eligible for the state Child Care Subsidy Program, but who are in need of either full or part-time child care due to their child's school's remote learning schedule. This assistance will be available through the end of 2020 for families with children, 5 to 13 years old, with annual incomes below \$75,000. The other component of the funding will go toward the reopening and sustainability of child care centers, including supplemental payments of \$75 per subsidy-eligible child per month. Also on hand for the announcement was Department of Human Services Commissioner Carole Johnson and Department of Children and Families Commissioner Christine Norbut Beyer.
